Procedure to be followed

The Sub-Committee followed the Audit & Governance (Hearing) sub-Committee Procedure which includes:

- The Investigating Officer's report and any other written submission or representations are taken as read
- Investigating Officer explains his report conclusions.
- Any Investigating Officer witnesses (none).
- Points of clarification for Subject Member or Sub-Committee from Investigating Officer.
- The Subject Member says what he wishes to say.
- The Sub-Committee may ask questions of the Subject Councillor.
- The Subject Councillor's witnesses (none).
- The Independent Person gives his views.
- The Committee to retire to consider its decision.

Summary of Investigating Officer's conclusions

The Investigating Officer reported that the investigation was hampered by Cllr Soper not engaging with the process. The Investigating Officer had considered the representations submitted by the Subject Member after the investigation and confirmed that it did not change his conclusions. He did note the concerns raised by Cllr Soper and if he or the Parish Council had concerns of a fellow Member this needed to be referred to the Monitoring Officer. The Parish Council have no powers and, by acting as he did, the Councillor had stepped outside of this process. The findings reached would be the same if Cllr Soper had submitted his submission as part of the investigation and the Investigating Officer also noted that there was no apology from the Subject Member for his actions.

Summary of additional representations from Subject Member

Cllr Soper apologised for not responding to any paperwork and said he was not good with computers, preferring face to face meetings. Mr Soper stated that the statement he read out at the parish council meeting did not name anyone. The Parish Council was falling apart with Councillors either resigning or considering resignation. The Parish Council called the meeting, he did not call the meeting. At this meeting two Councillors acted in way that he had never seen before and another stormed out. The Subject Member did not consider that his actions would go this far and result in a complaint.

Views of Independent Person

The Independent Person was consulted for his views and confirmed that he agreed with the Investigating Officer's findings that the Code had been broken.

The Sub-Committee's Decision	Having considered the materials set out above and hearing from the Subject Member and Investigating Officer, the Sub-Committee accepted the Investigating Officer's finding that the Subject Member had broken the Code for the reasons set out in the Investigating Officer's report. It was noted that the Subject Member had apologised for not engaging in the investigative process.
Decision on Sanctions	 Having consulted the views of the Independent Person and Investigating Officer, the Sub-Committee decided that sanctions were appropriate and decided to apply the following: To censure the Councillor as he had behaved inappropriately to the complainant and the language used was inappropriate and he had not engaged with the investigation process To instruct the Monitoring Officer to request the Councillor and the wider Parish Council attend training on governance, leadership and IT.
